Tip: To access OhioLINK databases go to the State Library web site, www.library.ohio.gov and select 'catalog' listed on the top of the left column. Then, on the catalog page select *Access OhioLINK databases from any other location*—may require authentication with a State Library card.

The **Lexis-Nexis U.S. Serial Set Digital Collection** is found at <http://www.library.ohio.gov/govinfo/slogovt.html>—click on Serial Set.

The Serial Set allows simultaneous searching of U.S. Congressional Hearings, Committee Reports, House and Senate documents dating to the early 1800's. It also contains legislative histories 1969 to the present and maps 1789 to 1969. Access is available with a State Library card. Backfiles of The Hill, Roll Call, and the Washington Post are searchable.

Public Access to Court Electronic Records (PACER) at <http://www.library.ohio.gov/govinfo/slogovt.html>, is a service that allows users to obtain pleadings and case and docket information from Federal Appellate, District and Bankruptcy courts, and the U.S. Party/Case Index via the Internet. It is currently available within the State Library, through a Federal trial with the Government Printing Office and the United States Courts.

2009 Fiscal Year Budget of the U.S. Government at <http://www.gpoaccess.gov/usbudget/> is issued by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB). The Budget of the United States Government contains the budget message of the President, information about the President's budget proposals for a given fiscal year, and other budgetary publications that have been issued throughout the fiscal year. Other related and supporting budget publications, such as the Economic Report of the President, are included, which may vary from year to year. The current and previous years are searchable.

The **Federal Accounting Standards Advisory Board** web site <http://www.fasab.gov/accepted.html> includes drafts and documents for comment, projects, reports, and news releases of the Board.

Federal Reserve Economic Data at <http://research.stlouisfed.org/fred2/>. FRED provides historical U.S. economic and financial data, including daily U.S. interest rates, monetary and business indicators, exchange rates, balance of payments and regional economic data.

The **Government Printing Office's GPO Access**, <http://www.gpoaccess.gov/> provides a central location for legislative, judicial, and administrative information, including the U.S. Code, Code of Federal Regulations, Federal Register, Congressional bills, Congressional Record, Statutes at Large, Guide to U.S. House and Senate Members, U.S. Government online bookstore, and links to federal agencies.

Economic Policy Institute, <http://www.epi.org/> is a non-profit think tank which conducts research and issues publications and working papers on economic issues.

IRS Tax Statistics, <http://www.irs.ustreas.gov/taxstats/index.html> contains business, individual, and charitable tax statistics and also includes publications and papers.

The **National Association of State Budget Officers**, <http://www.nasbo.org/publications.php> includes publications such as the Fiscal Survey of States, State Expenditure Report, a directory of state budget offices, other publications, and links to related organizations.

The **Ohio Department of Development's Office of Policy Research and Strategic Planning**, <http://development.ohio.gov/research/> provides data and analysis on the economic, industrial, and demographic trends of the State of Ohio, its businesses and its people.

The **U.S. Census**, <http://www.census.gov/> is the starting point for detailed statistical information by subject, geography, or special topic. The State Library of Ohio Government Documents librarians assist patrons in locating all types of census information to meet their needs.

The **U. S. Department of Commerce Bureau of Economic Analysis**, <http://www.bea.gov/> presents the latest national, international, regional, and industry economic statistics including Gross Domestic Product, Corporate Profits, Government Current Receipts and Expenditures, and more. The BEA's Survey of Current Business <http://www.bea.gov/scb/index.htm> keeps users up to date on relevant BEA issues and initiatives. Each issue includes numerous tables and charts of various economic estimates.

The **U.S. Department of Labor Bureau of Labor Statistics**, <http://www.bls.gov/> presents comprehensive information on the subject of labor. Ohio Labor Market Information <http://lmi.state.oh.us/> from the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services presents data and publications for Ohio.
